2011 PDC Hotel Scholarships

We are happy to announce that AGA's Chapter Hotel Scholarship program will continue at this year's PDC, which takes place July 10-13 at the Atlanta Marriott Marquis. The scholarship program covers room and tax for two individuals from each AGA chapter for up to five nights.

Members chosen by their chapter to receive the hotel scholarship are responsible for making their own reservations. Once a reservation is made, e-mail the confirmation number and arrival/departure dates to [Jessica Jones](#). There must be a separate name listed for each confirmation number provided. Approximately two weeks prior to the PDC, members participating in the scholarship program will be moved to AGA's master account and have their room and tax charges billed directly to AGA.

The PDC conference rate is \$132 (plus tax) per night until June 20, or until the room block is sold out. Reservations received after June 20, or after the block is filled, may be subject to higher rates. AGA's scholarship program will not cover rooms booked at a higher room rate. To make a reservation, please call the hotel directly at 866.469.5475 and mention you are attending the "AGA PDC" to ensure you receive the discounted rate. Please do not mention the scholarship, as this may cause confusion when trying to book a room. You may also [reserve a room online](#).

All hotel rooms are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis until the hotel is sold out. We encourage you to make your reservations early. If you have any questions regarding the hotel scholarship program, please contact [Jessica Jones](#).
